STATEMENT OF POLICY OF THE ASSOCIATION

The professional problems of psychology are best handled at the national level by the national organization and at the local level by the state organizations. The Midwestern Psychological Association will therefore retain its traditional function of encouraging psychology as a science rather than as a profession. This principal will continue to be reflected in the programming procedures and membership standards.
