LeeAnn Bartolini, Dominican University of California; bartolini@dominican.edu Quantitative and qualitative research methodologies were used to explore the non-clinical motivations for sharing poetry with others. The perceived impact of giving poems to others, and the Big Five personality variables associated with reading and sharing poetry in a general population were analyzed.

11:45 Scale Development/Validation of Process and Outcome Task Focus Measures. Thomas Vaughan-Johnston, Li-Jun Ji, Faizan Imtiaz, Queen's University; thomasvaughanjohnston@gmail.com We developed measures of Process and Outcome task orientations, and report the results of exploratory and confirmatory factor analyses (total N=1874), test-retest reliability after one (N=161) and two (N=147) month delays, and convergent/discriminant validity (N=209). We also examined predictive validity for both scales (N=209).

12:00 Adults' Greatest Life Challenges Inform Personality and Psychological Well-Being. Raffles Cowan, Northwestern University; raffles.cowan@u.northwestern.edu We investigated whether interpretive processes in narratives of life challenges predict personality, depression, and well-being. 158 community adults' narratives were coded for structure and process variables, and these variables were factor analyzed. We then explored relationships between these narrative factors, personality traits, and measures of depression and well-being.

 1:00 *Relationships, Stress, and Sleep: How Effective Relationships Promote Better Sleep*. Huelsnitz et al. The impact of relationship effectiveness on sleep is examined in a 37-year longitudinal study. Individuals were interviewed about their relationship histories and their life stress at age 23 and 32. Results show that relationship effectiveness predicts sleep at age 37, but that the type of stressor (interpersonal or external) matters.

 4:00 *Profiling College Students' Learning Strategies Uses and Effects on Success*. Cheon-woo Han, Sue Farruggia, Bonnie Solomon.
 This study identified students' unique patterns of learning strategies in college using Latent Profile Analyses, including self-regulated learning, time management and academic goal engagement. Four profiles were identified: low strategic, high strategic, moderate strategic, and goal-oriented. Interventions designed to increase students' success should consider developing learning strategies, particularly goal engagement.
